MAKE IT YOUR OWN

Before you start building and decorating your model, read through the instructions so you understand how it all comes together. Then make a plan. Do you want to make Leo look battle-scarred? The choice is yours! Here is an example of a standard Leonardo to get you started!

PLAN

After reading through the instructions, figure out which pieces should be colored or painted before you build the model. For this project, assemble the model but leave out the arms, legs, katana swords, and shell pieces. Paint those separately and then put them together once they are dry.



TECHNIQUES

Paint each piece carefully. You will want to use a small paintbrush to get the details right. If it helps, also paint the tiny bandana pieces separately. Let dry completely before attaching them to the model.

MATERIALS

This sample was made using acrylic paints. It may take more than one coat to get good coverage.

ACCESSORIZE

Use an ink pen to draw on Leonardo's eyes.



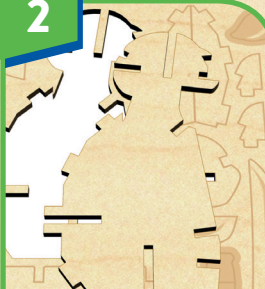

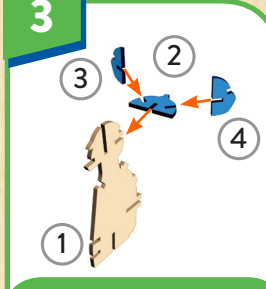
Match the board pieces to the numbers on the board image above to find your first two pieces.

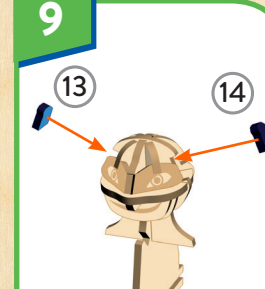
To put the two pieces together, match up the slots on each piece. Slide together.

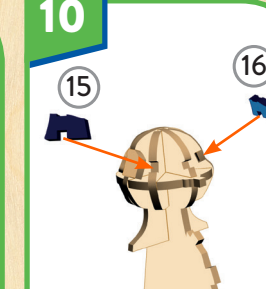


Continue assembling by putting pieces together in numerical order.

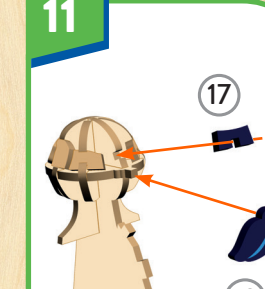
