

READ BEFORE ASSEMBLING:

- Go through the instructions one step at a time.

 Don't punch out all of the precut parts at once.


 Plywood thickness and color may vary.

 While not necessary, glue may be applied if desired.

 If you have trouble punching out the small pieces from the board, use tweezers or a toothpick to help.

 Adult supervision recommended.

MAKE IT YOUR OWN

Before you start building and decorating your model, make a plan. Do you want to make an exact replica of the project below or create something of your own design? Anything goes!

PLAN _

For this project, it's easiest to paint the arms separate from the model. Then, assemble everything together once the pieces are dry.

TECHNIQUES

Use a fine paintbrush and take your time, especially for the smaller engraved details. To give your model more depth, use darker shades of paint for shadows and lighter shades for the highlights.



COLORS

Start by painting the whole model silver except for the stand, which should be black. Then, continue painting all of the details like the vents and eye apertures black. By watering down your black paint, you can brush a thin layer over the engraved etchings to fill those in, and then, carefully wipe away any excess, leaving paint in the grooves. Paint white dots on the lenses of the eyes for highlights. For the flamethrower at the end of one of the arms, paint the end canister yellow and the knob on top red. Finally, add a finishing touch to your model by covering everything with various shades of watered down earth tones to add a little dust to the model and give it that true Fallout feel.
