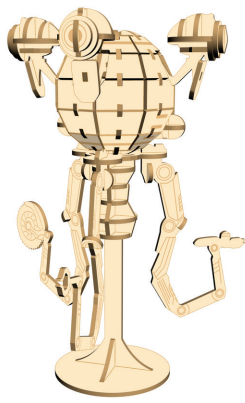


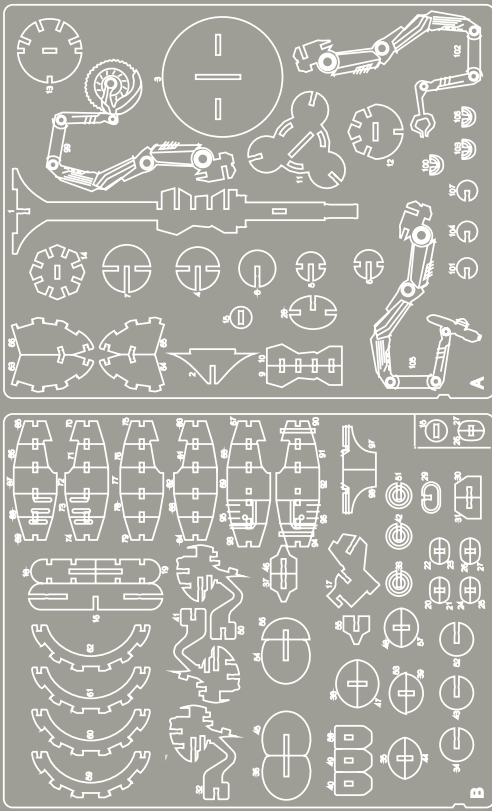
MR. HANDY BUILDING INSTRUCTIONS



READ BEFORE ASSEMBLING:

- Go through the instructions one step at a time.
- Don't punch out all of the precut parts at once.
- Plywood thickness and color may vary.
- While not necessary, glue may be applied if desired.
- If you have trouble punching out the small pieces from the board, use tweezers or a toothpick to help.
- Adult supervision recommended.

MAKE IT YOUR OWN

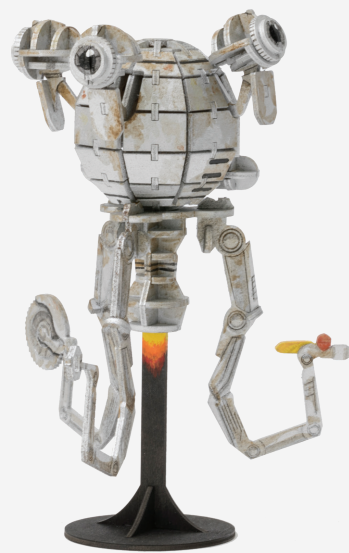
Before you start building and decorating your model, make a plan. Do you want to make an exact replica of the project below or create something of your own design? Anything goes!

PLAN

For this project, it's easiest to paint the arms separate from the model. Then, assemble everything together once the pieces are dry.

TECHNIQUES

Use a fine paintbrush and take your time, especially for the smaller engraved details. To give your model more depth, use darker shades of paint for shadows and lighter shades for the highlights.



COLORS

Start by painting the whole model silver except for the stand, which should be black. Then, continue painting all of the details like the vents and eye apertures black. By watering down your black paint, you can brush a thin layer over the engraved etchings to fill those in, and then, carefully wipe away any excess, leaving paint in the grooves. Paint white dots on the lenses of the eyes for highlights. For the flamethrower at the end of one of the arms, paint the end canister yellow and the knob on top red. Finally, add a finishing touch to your model by covering everything with various shades of watered down earth tones to add a little dust to the model and give it that true *Fallout* feel.



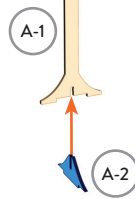

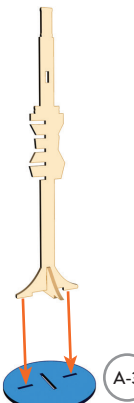
Pop out only these puzzle pieces from the board.

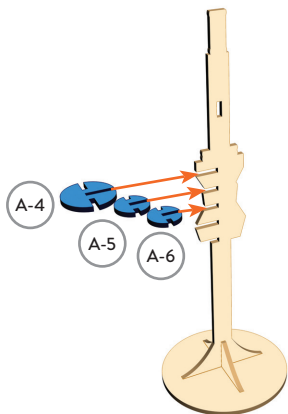
To put the two pieces together, match up the slots on each piece. Slide together.

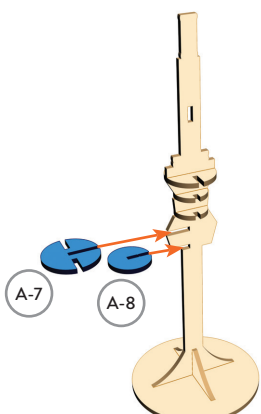


Continue assembling by putting pieces together in numerical order.

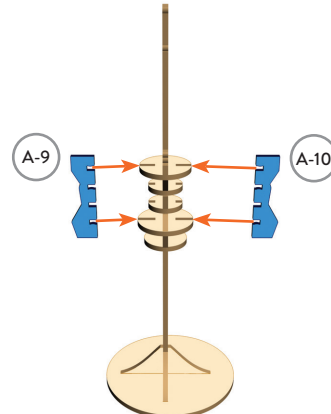

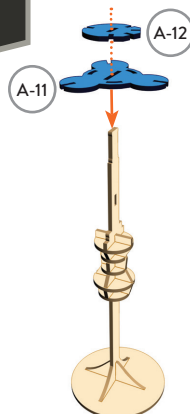

Pay careful attention to the orientation of these pieces. Make sure the half of piece 11 that has two slots lines up with the half of piece 12 that has 4 notches.

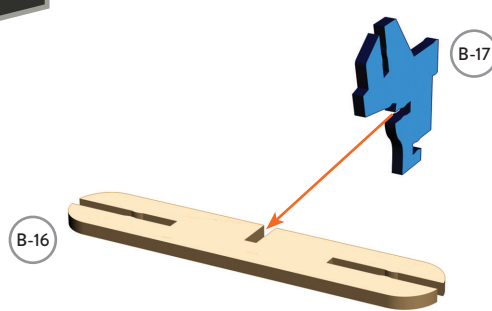
Make sure the half of piece 13 with extra notches on the edge is facing toward the left of the model. Also, note that piece 13 should only slide about halfway down piece 1.

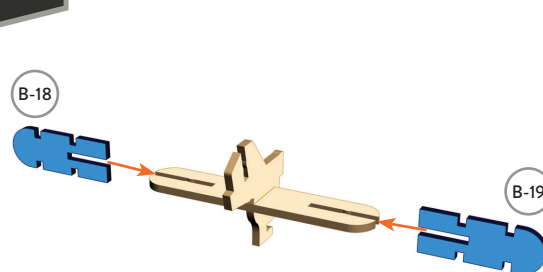


Pieces 14 and 15 should stay at the very top of piece 1.

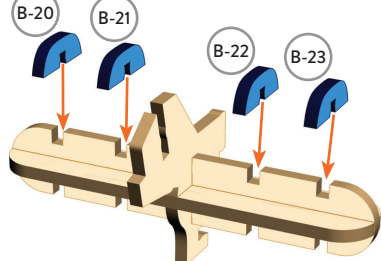

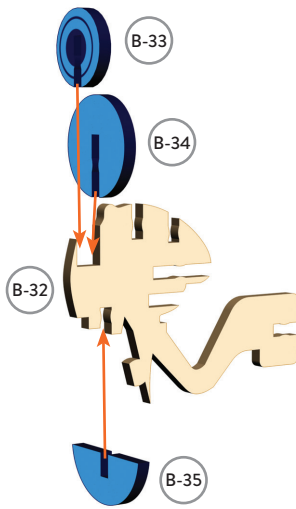


Attach piece 29 so that it is flush with the edge of piece 17.

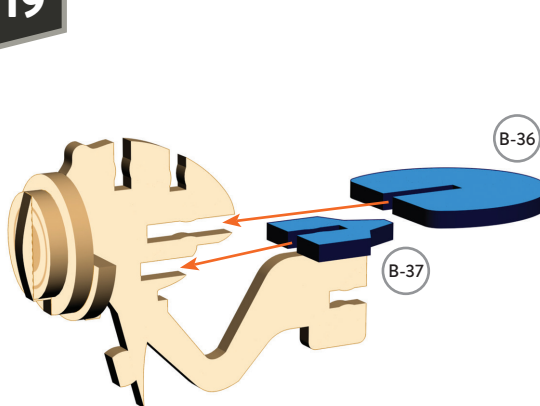
